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## OBJECTIVES

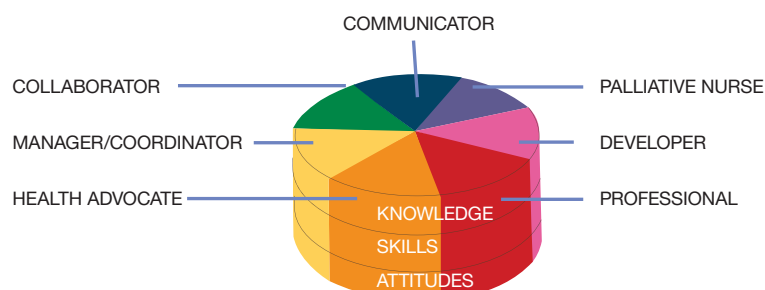
- To ensure that life-threatened and dying patients have equal access to high quality palliative care
- To provide possibilities for nurses to obtain and develop competencies as knowledge, skills and attitudes, needed to practice appropriate palliative care in Denmark

## METHODS

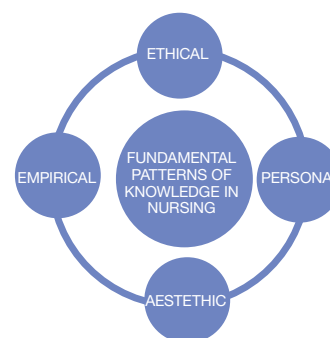
An interdisciplinary coordination group was created in 2010 in order to provide consensus and possibilities for creating palliative curricula for relevant professionals. In 2010-2012 sixteen nurses analyzed national and international curricula documents to identify existing and future competences in palliative nursing at:

- A-level:** the pre-graduate palliative area
- B-level:** the post-graduate basic palliative area
- C-level:** the specialist palliative area
